Miss H Palmer; Cllr J Jackson; Cllr A Godfrey; Cllr M Steel; Cllr Mrs S Cade and Cllr S Gerry</p> <p>Also in attendance: Clerk Mrs Alison Clothier; Dorset Cllr Robin Cook</p> <p><u>MEMBERS OF PUBLIC</u> – There were 9 members of the public present.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A member of the public spoke regarding the call for sites letter from Dorset Council. They asked whether the Council is looking to purchase land for housing. Cllr Cook explained that this is part of the new Local Plan and is the first stage of the process. The application can be put in whether or not you own the land. • A statement from the public was read out regarding planning application 3/19/1411/FUL. This was in support of the application regarding the benefits of this facility for young people. The facility needs indoor space to support the activities. • Three testimonials were read out in support of Horserenity from an 8 year old boy and a young adult that had benefited from the facility and a youth advisor that had referred clients to the facility. A member of the public gave a statement of support regarding an education perspective. • A director of Horserenity, spoke about the planning application. They are a community interest company and are delivering diversified employment, the social level is covered by the testimonials and environmentally the proposal is very low impact with small structures, plus natural grazing for a herd of six horses. The site is within the Greenbelt but this is an outdoor based activity which has a public benefit.
